

**MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING OF MAY 14, 2012  
AT ST. PAUL TOWN HALL**

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor pro tem McCasland. Mayor Walter was not present. There was a quorum. Mayor pro tem McCasland led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes: Council reviewed the minutes from the March 09, 2012 Council meeting. Councilman Gensler motioned to approve the minutes with a second to the motion made by Councilman Scanlan. The motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Expenses: Council reviewed the expenses report. Councilman Simmons motioned to approve the monthly expenses report with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.

Citizen's Comments: Mrs. Simmons commented that a Collin County representative was to call Town Hall about removing trash from the County side of St. Paul Road.

Cancelled Election Action: Election certificates were handed out to Councilmen Kellow and Simmons as official induction into Office.

Discussion/Appointment of Mayor pro tem: Mayor pro tem McCasland offered to continue as pro tem. Council thanked Mayor pro tem McCasland for his term as mayor pro tem. Councilman Scanlan motioned to reappoint Mayor pro tem McCasland with a second to the motion made by Councilman Gensler. The motion passed unanimously.

Discussion/Action on Road/Paving Needs: Council reviewed the estimated costs from the County and Wopac for road paving and noted the County did not quote surface costs. Councilman Simmons motioned to go ahead with full depth reclamation staying within \$175,000 and preferring financing with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.

Discussion/Action Regarding Request for Police Patrols on Rolling Meadows: Council discussed the issue of vehicles and motorcycles racing up and down and across lawns on Rolling Meadows and in the Vista Oaks subdivision. Secretary Dunn will ask the Sheriff's department to increase patrols in these areas. Council also discussed businesses operating out of homes and previous conclusions regarding same. In the meantime if anyone observes suspicious activity they should call the Sheriff.

Mayor's comments:

Code Enforcement/Status – Council reviewed the enforcement activity and reports and suggested removing aged items.

“Clean Up Day” Summary – There were 5 dumpster loads removed and 127 tires collected.

Status Update – Paving lien reminders from the Attorney are in process as is the RFP for ambulance services.

Adjournment: Councilman Scanlan motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:33 p.m. with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.
