

**MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING OF OCTOBER 08, 2012  
AT ST. PAUL TOWN HALL**

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Walter. There was a quorum. Mayor Walter led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes: Council reviewed the minutes from the September 10, 2012 Council meeting. Councilman Scanlan motioned to approve the minutes with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.

Council reviewed the minutes from the September 24, 2012 Board of Adjustment meeting. Councilman Gensler motioned to approve the minutes with a second to the motion made by Councilman Scanlan. The motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Expenses: Council reviewed the expense report and had several questions on some of the entries and suggested that the next animal control contract include gas charges in the annual fee. Councilman Scanlan motioned to approve the monthly expense report with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.

Citizen's Comments: None

Discussion/Action of the Recent Town Survey and Award Drawing from Survey Responses: Council discussed the recent Survey which had about 60 returns and summarized some of the categories. The large lot and low density beliefs were reinforced. The survey results will continue to be tallied and the results will be distributed to Council and posted on the website. The names of the early recipients selected at random for \$25 gift cards were James Metcalf and Emory LaPoint.

Discussion/Action Regarding Curb Marking for Hydrants: At a previous meeting it was requested that the Town paint the curbs near fire hydrants on Lakeway and Lavon Parkway. Council discussed this issue and was in favor of this. Staff reviewed the issue with the Wylie fire chief and he concurred with the marking. Councilman Gensler stated that his Scout troop could do the work as a Civic project.

Mayor's comments:

Code Enforcement/Status – Council reviewed the mowing and violation reports.

Other: – Mayor Walter discussed the Hanover project and potential selecting of a different developer by the land owners. We also updated Council on his meetings with legislators Lautenberg and Paxton to present the views of the Town. Medicare is a large concern for the next legislation.

Adjournment: Councilman Gensler motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:55 p.m. with a second to the motion made by Councilman Kellow. The motion passed unanimously.
